USS SAM HOUSTON MEDALLIONS (CHALLENGE COINS)

Sales of medallions for the SSBN and SSN configurations of the boat are ongoing. The major difference between the coins is the dolphin side of the coins that addresses the two different missions of the boat. The SSBN version costs \$12, while the SSN version costs \$15. (The cost difference is the result of the need to create a new mold for the SSN medallion. The SSBN design was in existence before our first order of those medallions.)

MORE INFO ABOUT THE "BAILOUT"

[Ed. Note: The following article relates to one that was in the previous edition of "The Raven" which involved a "bail out," later to become known as an "Emergency Blow." The boat had a down angle of about 45 degrees.]

"The Bailout event was my first patrol. I was sitting in the galley eating and facing aft so that I could see the Chiefs' table. I did not know what to think until I looked at Chief White's face, and he looked like a dead man . . . that was when I realized we were in deep shit. Just sat there holding onto the table so that I would not fall over backward wondering what it was going to be like when the bulkheads collapsed. When they passed the word "loss of all hydraulics," it sounded like a dead man telling the living why they perished!

"I can remember what the Throttleman looked like but can't recall his name. The RO played a key roll as well. The reactor was held at under 100% power by driving rods; thus, pulling stored heat off the coolant. Those reactors followed the steam demand; so, if he would not have driven rods hard, the reactor would have tried to match the 110% steam flow that was being pulled by the Trottleman, and the reactor would have scrammed . . .The End.

"The event started from a hydraulic leak in the aft end of the Engine Room. In trying to isolate it, the Auxiliaryman ended up isolating Main and Vital Hydraulics. He did not report the leak prior to trying to isolate it."

Have you ever wanted to visit the Holy Loch area again? An opportunity exists that might make it feasible. The Site One Holy Loch Assn. is having its 2013 reunion in Scotland as indicated in the following announcement:

REPLICA OF THE SHIPBUILDER'S PLAQUE

I located a vendor that can make a reduced-size replica of the Shipbuilder's Plaque. I don't know the exact dimensions of the original, but I think that 15 in. wide X 12" in. high would be good size for the replica. The material of the original is most likely bronze, but I think aluminum will be good for a replica. Aluminum will be much lighter but the color will not match. Bronze is available but at a much higher cost. Bronze will be a much heavier material but a better match in overall appearance. Aluminum will cost \$394 and weigh about 10 lb.; bronze, \$711 and 28 lb. I could reduce the size of the replica to reduce prices.

Nevertheless, a vote of the members will be required to spend the money. This replica will be displayed at our reunions. Transporting 10 lb. will be easier than 28 lb. I'll pursue this at the reunion.



FROM DON RAIRDAN [MM2(SS), BLUE, 1975-1977]

"After reading the latest newsletter, I realized I should have chimed in earlier in response to when the 609 crossed the Date Line in transit to Guam. We were three days out of Pearl, heading for Guam, when I was informed my brother had died. This was 10 Nov 75, so it was probably a few days before we crossed the Date Line. I think it took about 2 weeks to get to Guam, but not sure. The first patrol out of Guam (#37) would have been in late '75.

"I got to Pearl in Aug 75 and hooked up with the Blue Crew waiting for the Big Sam to arrive. The attached pic [below] is of the Big Sam coming by Ford Is. for the first time. I sat on the Boat Launch/Seaplane Launch on Ford Is. for a couple hours waiting for her to come by so I could get the picture. We knew the approximate time when she was to arrive. I do remember her being a week or so late.

"There was a change of command shortly after the 609 got to Pearl. Commander Rich was the new captain. He was the one to inform me of my brother's death. Although he was the only captain I served under, others have said he was the best. I was really sad when I heard he was on Eternal Patrol. May he rest in peace.

"I was attached to the 609 (mid-'75 'til May 77) from graduation of Nuc School. Found out I could get discharged under the Sole Surviving Son clause—a year and a half after my brother's death. I was up for E-6 when they changed the rules and added another year of service to be eligible. This kind of upset me, and I decided to get out.


"I did three patrols--37,39, and 41. Very memorable time of my life. I will attach a couple more pics of the time on the Big Sam."

ONE OF THE PLANNERS OF "CHRISTMAS FOR KIDS" IDENTIFIED

You might remember an article in this year's first edition of "The Raven" about a Christmas party that the Blue Crew held for children in an orphanage. **Ed Rabbit** [RM1(SS), Blue, 1964-1965] provides the following comment:

"The article on the 'Christmas for the Kids' in the orphanage in Holy Loch is pretty much correct. I and a Storekeeper, a 1st class at the time as I was (I don't remember his name), were the two guys on the plane who started this get-together and approached the captain to get permission to do to it. However, the money was collected after quarters topside the first day we took over the boat as "Stores" stood at one hatch, and I at the other, took up the collection. Stores and I went to town to buy the gifts, and it is true that the merchants, when they found out what we were doing, cut the prices in half. We had a hard time spending all the money—it was somewhere around \$350. We were supposed to get 40 children, but one got sick and could not come aboard; so, we had 39. I was one of the daddies and had a 6-year-old little girl that I still remember very much this day with tears in my eyes. I will say it was the best Christmas present I ever had in my life with those kids that day. I tell my grandkids about it as often as I can so that they realize how well they have it in this country. I, for one, will never forget that Christmas. It also was the first Christmas away from my kids, but it was worth every minute of it."

The next edition (October) of "The Raven" will NOT serve as a reminder to register for the reunion because it will be issued AFTER the registration deadline. Thus if you plan to attend the reunion, please do not let the deadline pass. Your presence at our reunions is essential to the enjoyment and subsequent success of our reunions.
