
IS THE CO GOING SENILE?


BERGERS BASKETBALL


The hottest team in the NBA this season seems to be the Boston Celtics. What? You're surprised that the "doormat" Celtics are now a contender? Here's why...

KYONGJU

ETC BURGER

For many of us, the highlight of our visit to Korea was Kyongju, Korea's museum without walls. For the last couple of years, especially with the Bicentennial celebrations, Americans have become more aware of and interested in our history. But we forget that we are a new country until we visit a country like Korea.

In 668 AD, the Silla Dynasty united the inhabitants of the Korean peninsula as one country. In 668 AD, the Saxons of England were resisting the Danish and Viking invaders, the Roman Empire was a crumbling ruin as the dark ages settled over Europe, and the teachings of Mohammed were being spread over the Mid-East and North Africa at the point of a sword. Kyongju is an attempt by the government of the Republic of Korea to remind Koreans of their ancient heritage and long history as a unified people.


About a 3½ hour drive from ChinHae, Kyongju is a collection of museums, tombs, monuments, palaces, and temples of the 1000 year long Silla Dynasty. Our first stop was at Pulguksa Temple. Started in the fourth century (AD), the temple is not only a reminder of the Silla period but is also a monument to the resiliency of the vorean people, for each succeeding wave of invasion has attempted destroy it. At one point, our guide explained that the buildings ere not the originals but had been rebuilt after the Japanese invasion. It was some time before I realized that he was referring to an event in 1583, not 1910.

The temple itself is a colorful collection of large and small pavillions nestled in a beautiful mountain hillside. Each pavillion has its specific use and contains statues of Buddha in representation of his attributes. Still used as a place of worship, the Temple is a favorite pilgramage site for newlyweds. The sight of women in the traditional bright green and red bridal gowns was an interesting contrast to the more somber clothing of most visitors.

The main stop of the afternoon was at the Kyongju Museum, a modern building embracing many of the classical features of Korean architechtures. It houses an interesting collection of clay, stone, iron, bronze and gold artifacts of the Silla period. Of special note is the Emille Bell. Cast in the 700's this excellent example of the bell-makers art is reputed by legend to owe its resonant tones to the sacrifice of the casters baby niece.

Our special thanks must go to the USO for a fantastic Christmas dinner at the Kyongju Chosen Hotel. The buffet was the most expansive display of the culinary arts it has been my pleasure to ENJOY in a long time.
